## HAPPY 100<sup>TH</sup> BIRTHDAY TO MR. JACK LEADBEATER, FORMER LAKESHORE PRINCIPAL

Mr. Jack Leadbeater, a former principal of Lakeshore P.S., turns 100 years old today, November 26, 2018! He was a veteran of World War II and served in the Royal Canadian Air Force. After the war, he returned to Hamilton, Ontario and attended McMaster University. When he graduated, Mr. Leadbeater began his teaching career at Central Public School in a grade 7 class. He became friends with Mr. Nobel Stevenson, a grade 8 teacher at the school. The next year, Mr. Stevenson was asked to be the principal of Lakeshore and he invited his friend Jack to come and teach at Lakeshore P.S. Mr. Leadbeater moved from Central Public School to Lakeshore and taught there for several years.

He eventually become Principal of Lakeshore P.S. After a while, the idea of middle schools was becoming popular. The school board decided to send some principals on a training course in New York, on how to run middle schools. Mr. Leadbeater was one of the principals asked to go for the training and when he came back he was appointed the principal of a brand new middle school called John Tuck Public School. He recently attended the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Tuck Public School (now a K-8 school) and spoke at the formal ceremony.

When Mr. Leadbeater retired, he decided to spend his time teaching gliding lessons and flying his own plane, something he did until he turned 90! He still drives his own car and is an energetic member of the YMCA.
